Degree Programs

At the <u>University of Hawai'i at Mānoa</u>, the <u>College of Engineering</u>, provides degree programs with quality education, research, outreach and service programs for the local community. Their <u>Civil and Environmental Engineering (CEE) Department</u> "focuses on the activities of people and their interaction with the environment". There are three programs which are related to transportation - Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering Degree, Master of Science Program (Transportation concentration), and the Ph.D. Program.

Non-degree Programs

The Hawai'i (UH) Planning Program hosts the National Disaster Preparedness Training Center (NDPTC), which develops and delivers FEMA-certified training courses on disaster response and recovery and is part of the National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPTC). The Center has trained more than 23,000 first responders and emergency managers, including many transportation professionals, and has led the development of training for senior executives on the Science of Disasters at FEMA's Emergency Management Institute. The UH NDPTC incorporates PSR transportation resilience research into both face-to-face and online training courses for transportation professionals and other responders.
